Also working on the Point in Time Count in North Pacific County and will have a Project Homeless event January 28th in South County and invite anyone who would like to participate in this event.
  2. Stephanie Glover, CCAP: Senior Nutrition in Pacific and Grays Harbor County in Raymond and Ilwaco and we serve hot lunches Monday through Friday and do home delivery of hot and frozen meals. We are looking for a part-time substitute cook that can fill in for the Ilwaco area.
