- o. Talitha Cooper, GHC/AmeriCorps: Still offering financial literacy classes Wednesday 4–6pm and Thursday morning 9–11am. Planning a Money Smart weekend event the 3rd week in April at Raymond and Ilwaco High Schools for students after school program. Here representing Kelsey Hopstad, GHC with College Night and flyers were handed out.
- p. Shelly Lev, WHH: National Nutrition Month and Kidney Awareness Month-handouts were given on nutrition facts on sodium and sugars that lead to kidney disease.
- q. Red Hageman, ETS: Cervoxan and buprenorphine programs are taking off along with the flex program using methadone. Certified for 600 patients now.
- r. Nora LeBlanc, CCAP: We are still working on housing in Grays Harbor and Pacific Counties and the need is so far above what our resources are. We furnished the Long Beach office on Friday including phone service and will have an open house soon. Hiring new position Grays Harbor two in housing and one is senior nutrition.
- s. Bonnie Ryan, WHMA Food Bank and Pennywise: Pennywise is doing very well and getting a lot of donations. A lot of people are dropping stuff off that is not suitable causing our garbage bill to increase. Food Bank is planning the Spring Auction and Dinner here in the Willapa Harbor Community Center April 23rd all you can eat Spaghetti Feed for \$12. Flyers and donation slips were handed out.
- t. Sharon Block, PCHD: Remind everyone that the Health Department still does direct services, WIC clinics for moms and children up to 5 yrs old every week on Tuesdays and Thursdays, Family Planning Clinics the 1st and 3rd Fridays of the month with our Nurse Practitioner to help with birth control, exams, pregnancies, and STD checks and hepatitis-c. We serve uninsured, under insured, vulnerable populations and working on 3rd party billing for those with insurance and everything is on a sliding fee scale. Our immunization clinics are the 2nd and 4th Fridays of the month 1 – 4pm. We still offer flu shots, HPV, t-Dap, and Varicella. In 2017 it will be required that all kids have 2 chickenpox vaccinations.

- v. Carole Halsan, WHH: Hospital is still looking for physicians. Hopefully repairs should be done by the first week of April. We will keep everyone posted.
