- j. Sharon Madrid, VVHC: I am now the clinic manager for Valley View.

About 160 students from all five school districts participated all day with problem solving and the 10 essential leadership skills. Additional funding has been received so we will run the program again next year.

- o. John O'Lague, DSHS: I am the administrator for South Bend and Long Beach office and hope to get out there and see what I can do here in Pacific County.
