Lifeline Connections is Providing Mental Health Counseling in the Pacific County - South Bend Jail



Inmates in the Pacific County Jail now have access to mental health services thanks to a two year grant funded by the Great Rivers Behavioral Health Organization. Mental Health Professional, Cassandra Nichols meets with inmates regularly depending on their needs and desired services. Services include mental health assessments with the goal of starting group counseling sessions soon. Group topics may include topics such as anger management with the goal to have each inmate identify and develop skills to help manage their personal triggers. These skills are highly applicable and can help each individual become a functional member of the community.

In the first four weeks of the program, Ms. Nichols has met with over 20 inmates and currently carries a case load of 16. The program is voluntary and allows individuals to determine their own level of involvement. Simultaneous mental health and substance use disorder services (known as co-occurring) are offered if it is determined that the individual has a mental health condition that perpetuates drug use.

There are three avenues individuals can access services while incarcerated: I) At the time of arrest a screening is done by Judd Comer, Pacific County Public Health, Jail Liaison. The questions asked during the screening process are designed to identify if there is a mental health need. 2) An individual tells Mr. Comer they would like to see a mental health professional 3) An individual tells a corrections officer they want to see a mental health professional. One individual has already made the request to engage in additional counseling sessions upon release at Lifeline Connections Office located at 1006 Robert Bush Drive West South Bend, WA.

Ms. Nichols says that "The best part of the job is when they confide in me by saying "I've never told anyone this before but I think it is important for you to know." Ms. Nichols is clearly passionate about her work and she states: "I love this work! I love helping people especially the disenfranchised. I'm here because I want to be not because I have to be."

SMART TEAM (School, Medical, Autism, Review Team

Eligible children can be screened for autism and have a team to support their success. **SMART** (School-Medical Autism Review Team) pulls teachers and medical professionals together to work as a team for children on the autism spectrum. Connecting the dots between a variety of professional opinions can be confusing for anyone. These professionals can provide an autism screening and refer you to the best services (including ABA – Applied Behavior Analysis) to support a child's success in school and life. Your local SMART team is supported by **Northwest Pediatrics** (an Autism Center of Excellence) and can provide a local diagnosis of autism.
